Their email responses reminded me of two things:

Giving Them the Business

New Space for Bloomberg Financial Lab



When Bro. Thomas Cleary, S.M. '81 first approached Mrs. Tina Carlstrom about teaching a course on the Bloomberg Terminal, she was confused. At the time, Chaminade did not have a single terminal to use in the course. Now, with a brand new, state-of-the-art space, home to 20 terminals and two full-time faculty members, Chaminade has a truly one-of-a-kind Financial Literacy program.

"As a parent at the time, I attended the Chaminade Christmas party where Bro. Tom gave his 'State of the Union' address. When he said that Chaminade would soon be getting several Bloomberg terminals, I couldn't believe it. That was the beginning of our vision," Mrs. Carlstrom recalled.

Realizing the Vision

Five years later, the Bloomberg Financial Lab has outgrown its original space in the library and moved into a more modern, purpose-designed space. It features tiered seating and the same tools that one would expect to find on the floor of the New York Stock Exchange or

any major financial institution. A stock ticker even wraps around the wall displaying the Standard & Poor 100. It gives Flyers a taste of the fast-paced world of finance.

"The creation of the new Dolan Family Science, Technology, and Research Center freed up some of the labs in the main building, so we jumped on the opportunity to move upstairs and create this awesome space. The move is already paying dividends; the students are more engaged than ever!" explained Mrs. Carlstrom.

These terminals and the hiring of experienced faculty members, Mrs. Carlstrom and Mr. Kevin St. Pierre '85 (below), have positioned Chaminade to build a financial literacy program that is unique among American high schools. Here at Chaminade, all juniors and seniors are provided a firm foundation in business, high finance, and personal finance through our Financial Literacy course. This program is designed not only to prepare students for a possible future in finance and business but also life as a 21st-century adult and parent.

Flyers are given the opportunity to study equity and fixed income markets, business operations, analysis of financial statements, interest rates, currencies, and the use of the Bloomberg Terminal as a tool to deepen the understanding of these topics. In this way, our Financial Literacy course does more than prepare students for a future in business and

banking. It also helps students understand essential life skills, such as financing college costs, applying for a mortgage, planning for retirement, and even avoiding credit card debt.

"We want them to have all of the financial tools they will need when they graduate from Chaminade," offered Mr. St. Pierre. "That way, when they head off to college, and then out into the real world, they are prepared to make smart financial decisions for themselves and for their families - spending smartly, buying a house, saving for retirement, raising a family, and financing their own children's education. What they learn here will help them confidently navigate what can seem like overwhelming financial decisions."

A Truly Chaminade Experience

This unparalleled initiative complements Chaminade's long-standing commitment to educating the whole person. Just as the lessons learned in the "traditional" core classes translate across disciplines, skills learned in our Financial Literacy course – critical thinking, analysis, and creativity – can easily be applied to science, mathematics, social studies, and even religion.

In addition to the classes offered to current juniors and seniors, Chaminade sponsors summer Financial Literacy workshops and camps for middle school students from across Long Island and Queens. The lab is also open to any and all alumni who want to use the terminals. Any senior who is interested can earn a certification in the Bloomberg Terminal, an impressive credential for a budding business student.

It is safe to say that, whether it is paying dividends or helping juniors and seniors understand dividends, the new Bloomberg Financial Lab is a game changer.

Four young alumni take on the challenges of running a business, all while still in college.

Starting your own business can be a daunting task at any age, but four Chaminade alumni are taking on this challenge – all while still navigating college.

Juggling a growing business while studying for exams and writing papers has become second nature for Tim Ahlstrom '18, Anthony Capellupo '16, Dan Hepworth '18, and Ryan O'Connor '19. They now realize the lessons they learned at Chaminade – time and relationship management, personal accountability, and the benefits of a broad education – have served them well as they navigate their new industries.

Chaminade Prep

"Thinking back to comps...you can't study for everything in one night. You need to prioritize your time," remembered Dan Hepworth '18, the founder of The Massapequa Tutor, a growing company familiar to many Chaminade students who have worked as a tutor or utilized their test-preparation services.

For Dan, "taking advantage of the resources at your disposal, doing the right thing at the right time because it is the right thing to do, having excellent time management skills, and the ability to prioritize important tasks" are just a few of the vital skills that he learned during his time at Chaminade. He is not alone when it comes to sharing an appreciation for his Chaminade preparation.

"I feel that Chaminade prepared me extremely well," offered Ryan O'Connor '19, the founder of an app development business that can count Chaminade as one of its customers. "Building up the persistence to push through challenging and time-consuming work has allowed me to move efficiently through my weekly work and have time to work on expanding my business."

Anthony Capellupo '16 recalls his time in high school fondly. "During all four years at Chaminade, I played in the school's pep band. I was lucky enough to get to know Mr. Cassidy very well. We used to share our storied tales of chasing blitzing bluefish in the Western Sound or pursuing Blackfish on the south shore. Our daily conversations grew my affinity for the water even more."

It was this love of the water, and the dream of a career beyond an office window, that led Anthony to create "Out There Apparel," a lifestyle brand with a Long Island vibe.

"It is not a 9-5 job."

Perhaps it's something in the water at Chaminade, or maybe it's the high-quality students which the school has long attract-





ed, but each of these young entrepreneurs demonstrates real maturity in recognizing the challenges that come along with his undertaking.

These young men have learned that while developing their ideas and managing a business is fun, it also involves a tremendous amount of hard work and dedication.

However, responsibility and hard work are familiar to any Flyer, and these four are shouldering their burdens well. They share an inner drive to succeed, solve problems, and innovate.

"It is not a 9-5 job," Dan said, "but a full-time responsibility. I have around 100 bosses: my clients whose expectations I try my hardest to exceed."

Tim Ahlstrom '18 agreed. He can attest that one of the ways their time at Chaminade has benefited these CEOs is by preparing them to work - and work hard.

He reinvented his company, KXNG New York, and has expanded its offerings from footwear to apparel. It was certainly no easy lift, but the end result was worth the effort.

"If you have the right vision and work ethic, nothing really can stop you."

Back to Basics


With a course in Financial Literacy and access to a state-of-the-art suite of Bloomberg Terminals, every junior and senior is learning

Major League Talent

Logan Koester Makes the Jump from High School Champion to College Star

Logan Koester '19 found out that he had been drafted by the Philadelphia Phillies while driving with his father. It was a memory he will always cherish.

"I was in my car on a long drive home, but when we walked in the door, we had a special father-son moment," Logan recalled. "My reaction was one of pure excitement and utter joy, but it only took me a few days to realize that it was just the beginning."

High School Standout

During his time at Chaminade, Logan was a standout baseball player. He is only the sixth sophomore in school history to appear on the varsity baseball team and was a vital part of the 2019 championship team. After winning seven games and leading the Catholic League in home runs and RBIs, Logan was named Catholic League Pitcher of the Year and Long Island Player of the Year.

"Logan's success was instrumental in the Flyers winning the championship," according to Varsity Baseball Coach Mike Pienkos. "I have been the varsity head coach for 37 years, and I will remember Logan as one of the best players we have ever had."

A Draft Blueprint for Success

The Major League Baseball (MLB) draft differs greatly from any other major sport's draft. The MLB draft consists of 40 rounds,

and more than one thousand potential major leaguers are chosen every year as all 30 teams look to boost their farm system and build a perennial World Series contender. Many choose not to pursue the often grueling life of a minor league player.

The Phillies selected Logan with their 32nd draft pick, number 960 overall. He was the only Long Island high school student taken in the 2019 draft, and he had a difficult decision to make – accept the Phillies' offer and play professionally or take his scholarship and attend George Washington University (GW), a Division I program in Washington, D.C.

"It was easily the toughest decision I had to make in my life up to this point."



With guidance from his family and Coach Pienkos, Logan ultimately chose to play for the GW Colonials.

"[There were] so many factors, such as a future after baseball, that led me toward a great education at GW."

GW, a member of the Atlantic 10 Conference, opens its season at Nicholls State in Louisiana and hosts Georgetown University for their home opener. Logan figures to play a prominent role as the Colonials play a schedule featuring many teams familiar to Chaminade alumni – Virginia Commonwealth University (VCU), William and Mary University

ty, the University of Tennessee, and Fordham University, among others. It's safe to say that the Colonials of GW hit a home run with their new pitcher!

Discerning Young Men

The Society of Mary Embraces New Ways to Foster a Timeless Commitment

Everyone wants to find something that makes him happy, that fulfills him, and with which he can fall in love.

For many, this takes the form of a spouse and chosen career. For the Brothers and priests at Chaminade, this desire for fulfillment and happiness has led to the profession of the vows of poverty, chastity, obedience, and stability in the Society of Mary.

Frederick Buechner, the award-winning American writer and theologian, described a religious vocation as the space where the individual's "deep gladness and the world's deep hunger meet." Buechner's message resonates with Bro. Stephen Balletta, S.M. '74, Vocations Director for the Marianist Province of Meribah.

A Marianist Path to Happiness

"The Marianists showed me what it meant to be a part of a brotherhood in Christ," Bro. Stephen recalls more than 40 years after starting his own journey as a religious brother. "I saw their commitment to Catholic education; their excitement about learning; their passion for Jesus Christ, His Blessed Mother, and His Church; their palpable affection and camaraderie with one another and with the students; and their genuine joy of living the Gospel life."

Bro. Stephen has been asking young men what makes them profoundly happy – just as being a Marianist brings him great joy – since 2010, when he became the Province's vocations director. This role followed 34 years after professing his own first vows, an event he remembers well. All three of the novices who professed that day – all members of Chaminade's Class of 1974 – are still members of the Society of Mary. "I challenge any

profession class to match a perseverance rate like that," Bro. Stephen says with considerable pride.

Recent years have seen renewed growth in the order. Since the summer of 2018, three new Marianists, Bro. Andrew Santoriello '07, Bro. Peter Sennert '11, and Bro. Patrick Cahill '11, have professed Temporary Vows, and Bro. Thomas Terrill, n.S.M. '10 has taken the habit as a Novice. One young man has also begun a discernment year with the Brothers.

"Bros. Peter, Andrew, Patrick, and Thomas and our discerner have brought a contagious energy and enthusiasm into the Brothers' residence. Whenever I see them in chapel or hear them recounting the events of their day, I smile as I remember my own years as a young Marianist. And I know I'm not the only one who feels that way," Bro. Stephen explains.

Marianist Discernment

Those interested in becoming Marianists follow a multi-year process that allows them time to grow in faith as they discern their vocation, all while supported by a community of professed Brothers and priests.

New times have called for new modes of outreach, though.

"We had previously targeted a population that would join immediately after high school," Bro. Stephen notes. "Now we encourage prospective Marianists to complete


college. Some join right after college, some later. For vocations directors, it means a longer journey of accompaniment, but it pays off in greater maturity, deeper personal insight, and a clearer commitment to religious life over and above all the other possibilities available to these young men."

A prospective Marianist begins as an external discerner, having conversations with Bro. Stephen and other Marianists and joining them for prayer and meals on several occasions. This progresses to an internal discernment, during which time a vocation contact lives with the Community for periods at a time, eventually for an entire discernment year. Aspirancy advances the commitment, and the Novice dons the habit and is

called "Brother" for the first time. A two-year Novitiate culminates in the profession of Temporary Vows and, three to six years later, Perpetual Vows.

This change in approach has clearly borne fruit, with five young men in various stages of religious formation.

"I think they're happy, deeply happy," offers Bro. Stephen, "and if they have discovered the joy of living the Gospel life, and if they are determined to share that joy with others, then they are well on their way to being the next generation of Marianists who will serve the Church on Long Island."

A New Tradition






