Following morning and early-afternoon play, guests gathered at Nassau for a cocktail hour, live auction, and dinner. The Open also featured a silent auction where supporters could bid online.

"Our Chaminade Family always looks forward to this event," said Bill Basel '58, executive director of the Golf and Tennis Open. "It's a lot of fun, but it's also quite a meaningful day for everyone who gives back to our school."

Assistant Director of Alumni and Assistant Director of the Golf and Tennis Open Kevin Parente '82 noted, "Every year and all year, we work to make the Open the most enjoyable experience possible. Our courses closed quickly during registration this year, and many bidders

Christopher Foresto, M.D. '94 President

His first alumni event in 1994 would be his first as a chairman 20 years later. Dr. Chris Foresto may not have thought he would

eventually organize the annual Yearbook Barbecue, but it remains one of his favorite graduate gatherings.

After Chaminade, Chris would head off for Boston College and the Jacobs School of Medicine and Biomedical Sciences at the University at Buffalo. Today, he is the associate director and section chief of musculoskeletal imaging and intervention of the Long Island Division of Radiology at NYU Langone Health and is a clinical assistant professor and section chief at NYU Winthrop Hospital.

"The new Dolan Family Science, Technology, and Research Center will allow more alumni in the medical field to get involved," Chris said. Chaminade's recent advancements in science, technology, and research education are of special interest to Dan Barabino. He graduated with a bachelor's degree in chemistry and mathematics from Fairfield University in 1983 before completing master's and doctoral studies in chemistry from the University of Delaware.

Dan currently works for Oxford Instruments in business development; Oxford is a leading provider of high-technology tools and systems used by scientific researchers.

Management Division, where his focus is wealth and asset management.


"The Alumni Association is an extension of Chaminade's motto: 'Fortes in Unitate," Dan said. "Our greatest
